Dear praying friends and supporting churches,

We are thankful to the Lord for how he has led us and watched over us during our recent move. As explained in our last prayer letter before relocating, we are now in Texas a few miles from the Mexican border in a new ministry where I have traveled for training nationals on several occasions in the past few years. We have not lost our burden for Cuba and will resume making trips once we are better adjusted to our new ministry. One of our goals is to help establish some training programs in Cuban churches modeled after the Trinity Baptist Seminary extensions already in place in five countries.

Things have been busy around Frontier Baptist Missions with the last stages of repairs since a flood seriously damaged the property last summer. We thank the Lord for how He has provided funds, materials and work teams to make this possible. Bible colleges classes on site and online resume the 21st of January. The bookstore will be reopening in a few days with wholesale prices on Bibles as a ministry to local churches, including many pastors across the border who come to purchase Bibles and discipleship/Bible study material to take back to Mexico. We will be hosting a pastor's conference in Mexico the first week of February. The focus of the conference will be practical training on how to help people through the various stages from salvation, baptism, and discipleship to becoming a faithful productive member of a local church.

I have mostly good news about my health. In my last letter I mentioned having been diagnosed with Melanoma under a thumbnail requiring amputation of part of my right thumb just before our move. My surgeon followed up with the pathology reports. He said the Melanoma had gone all the way to the bone, which makes my cancer Stage 2, but it was within the margins of the amputation. This means the amputation was absolutely necessary and successful. The lymph node test shows cancer has not spread, praise the Lord! He figured chemotherapy is likely not necessary at this point, but since it had gone to the bone, the Melanoma is aggressive, so it could reappear somewhere else. We have scheduled follow-up appointments with new doctors in our new location. Thank you so much for your prayers!
